I thank you and the members of nominations and recruitment committee for the King Faisal International Prize for choosing me to win this prize. This indicates your appreciation and trust in a small enlisted man in the exalted Islamic work as possible as I can. I do known the value of this prize, and appreciate the exalted Islamic spirit and the noble sentiment which was and is still behind this work of both the King Faisal Foundation and the Saudi government that support the service of Islam widely.
