We are the custodians of Science and attendants of God's Book. No wonder that the sons of the late King Faisal have decided to encourage research and study as a means to immortalize the memory of their great father, because this act is usual practice of the Saudi dynasty.

When I came first to Holy Makkah in 1946, there were only three secondary schools in the whole Kingdom namely: Jeddah High School, Medina High School, and the preparation of Scholastic missions. While members of the Egyptian Ministry of Education mission did not exceed thirty teachers and five from AI-Azhar graduates in total. When I came to Riyadh in 1972 I found innumerable secondary schools, and that many universities were established having various departments and objects. This is a testimony for history record.

What steps are faster! What determination is stronger, and what generosity is more exuberant than what was spent for education in such a brief period which I witnessed. May God reward whose the prize bears his name, those in-charge as well as who confer it with the best compensation.

main supporter and backer, as well as its guardian from the very beginning, and we have nothing but to extend to him thanks and appreciation.
