Speech of Professor Yousef A. Khulaif

at the ceremony of awarding him the Prize 12.8.1409H. t March 19, 1989

In the Name of Allah, the Merciful, the Compassionate

Your Royal Highness, Prince Abd Allah Ibn Abd Alt Aziz, The Crown Prince, Your Highnesses, the Princes, Your Eminencies and Excellencies, Distinguished guests Ladies and Gentlemen,

It will be a matter of exaggeration if we claim that literature can depict the human feelings overwhelming in one's mind, because some of these feelings, for being exuberant and overcrowding, are not easy to convey by means of language, because language is governed by systematic law, while self-introspection is a 1imitless and unrestricted world as the soul and spirit. This prize indicates to me special feeling of happiness, as I have returned to recall the memories of Najd, the land of Poetry, horses, gentle winds and wild roses, where the springs of poetry had erupted 15 centuries ago, and witnessed the early creative pioneers who charted their tracks in this virgin land, paving the way for the caravan of poets which followed in their footsteps.

Praise be to God for his exuberant graces which I cherish, and my sincere thanks to the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques, the ornament and pride of Arabs, as they watch him reviving their glory and golden past when they were once the masters of the world contributing to its civilization and carrying torches of 1ight in the whole parts of earth. Also, thanks to their Royal Highnesses the sons of the late King Faisal Ibn Abd Al-Aziz who have immortalized his memory by establishment of this prestigious foundation which is based on benefaction, Philanthropy and pious deeds. This Foundation has made genuine and true work through its message to Islam and Arabism, and revived a cultural, literary and scientific renaissance and to realize welfare of man everywhere. Hence, we pray God to reward them for this noble deed.

Also thanks to their Royal Highnesses the princes, ancestors of the noble Saudi dynasty which realized this prestigious position for this peninsula which it deserves on earth, In addition to the prosperity and architecture prevailing the whole Kingdom, and the torches of hope are

1ighted in its whole areas.
