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CoS Winner of the King Faisal International Prize In Arabic Literature (1411H/1991)

Your Royal Highness Prince Sultan bin Abdel Aziz, Representative of the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques in patronizing this ceremony Your Highnesses, dignitaries, and men of science, thinking and literature

Assalam Alaikum w Rahmatullah Wabarakatu

I stand before you today overwhelmed with pride at your cultural achievements and your dedication to the service of mankind in general and Arabs and Saudis in particular.

The various cultural and scientific establishments bear witness to the manifestations of this overwhelming advancement which has spread into the world with as much vigour as we feel it around the Kingdom. This renaissance was initiated by your great father, King Abdul Aziz (may God bless his soul). When God ordained the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques to be his successor, the Custodian did not spare any effort in working with the same spirit. Other members of the Royal Family have also worked within this framework. Prince Faisal (then Crown Prince) listened to a reading of my poetry. His words of praise and encouragement still echo in my ears.
